



SERRO DE LA SELVA


THIS ROUTE CAN BE CONSIDERED AS A MODEL FOR THE RESTORATION OF A HISTORIC PATHWAY WHICH HAD FALLEN INTO DISUSE ON ACCOUNT OF CHANGES IN THE LIFE-STYLE OF LOCAL SOCIETY, AND OVER RECENT DECADES HAD BECOME COMPLETELY OVERGROWN.

IN 2006, A LOCAL FAMILY DECIDED TO SEEK SUPPORT IN TO RESTORE THE PATHWAYS OVER THE SIERRA AS THE PEOPLE WHO HAD USED THEM OVER MANY YEARS AS PART OF THEIR EVERYDAY LIFE WERE NOW BECOMING ELDERLY. THIS WAS WHEN THE BOOK "SIERRA DE PEDRO PONCE; LA MONTAÑA OLVIDADA" (SIERRA DE PEDRO PONCE: THE FORGOTTEN MOUNTAIN) WAS PUBLISHED.

FROM THIS STARTING-POINT, THE PATHWAY HAS BEEN RESTORED. IT LINKS THE SETTLEMENT TO THE HIGHER PART OF THE SIERRA THROUGH THE PEDRO PONCE RAVINE, NEAR THE MORRON DE RIVAZUELO ROCK-FACES AND COMING UP OVER THE AREA OF LA SELVA AT ITS HIGHEST POINT.

IT IS AN EASY PATH TO WALK, WITH DIFFERENT TYPES OF ECOSYSTEMS AND INTERESTING ENVIRONMENTAL AND CULTURAL VALUES GIVING EVIDENCE OF THE STRONG LINK BETWEEN THE INHABITANTS OF THE AREA AND THE USE OF NATURAL RESOURCES OVER THE CENTURIES.


